Mt. Zion Receives Non-Profit Security Grant

On September 26, 2023, the Healey-Driscoll Administration announced that a total of \$4,013,340 has been awarded through the Nonprofit Security Grant Program (NSGP) to address priority security needs at faith-based and community service organizations at heightened risk of a hate crime or terror attack.

"Communities rely on nonprofit and faith-based organizations for essential social services, spiritual support, and guidance," said Governor Maura Healey. "Our Administration is deeply committed to ensuring these vital organizations have the tools and resources needed to create safe, inclusive, and protected environments. These federal funds provide critical support to our nonprofit and faith communities while strengthening Massachusetts' ability to uphold our values and celebrate our diversity."

We are pleased to announce that Mt. Zion is one of the recipients, receiving \$149,565. With this grant, plans are to update and increase our security through better cameras, doors, windows, etc. Over the next two years, as we expend these funds, our focus will be on taking proactive steps to better secure our property and facility. More information will be shared in upcoming weeks.



# A Woman of the Movement: MRS. WILLIE PEARL MACKEY KING

On Saturday, September 23, 2023, Mt. Zion was blessed to have as our guest, Willie Pearl Mackey King.

Mrs. King, a legend of the Civil Rights Movement, engaged in an hour-long conversation with our Pastor, **Dr. Atu White**, discussing everything from her childhood, her time at the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) where she worked from 1962-1966, and her experience transcribing Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s *"Letter from Birmingham Jail"* in April 1963. In addition, she shared personal insights on the 1963 March on Washington and the 16<sup>th</sup> Street Baptist Church bombing in Birmingham, Alabama, where four (4) Black girls were killed, in 1963.

On a damp and raining morning, over 100 people came out to listen to the conversation between Mrs. King and Pastor White. It was an extremely interesting and educational opportunity to hear from someone who was not only an eyewitness to some of the Civil Rights events, but a participant as well. Her candor, humor, and recollection of events was simply spellbinding.

Following the "Conversation," a luncheon was held in the gym for Mrs. King where she so graciously posed for pictures with the many people who requested a photo with her. She also returned to Mt. Zion on Sunday morning and joined us in our worship service.



# OUR 46<sup>TH</sup> CHURCH ANNIVERSARY ~ GOD IS FAITHFUL!

The recognition of Mt. Zion's 46<sup>th</sup> Church Anniversary was held Sunday, September 24, 2023, at our 10:00 a.m. worship service.

Pastor White outlined the 'State of the Church,' sharing several upcoming plans, including looking for a Youth Pastor and a plan to eliminate our mortgage. (See next article.) As a church body, we also paid reverence to the three (3) members who had gone on to Glory since our last Anniversary celebration. Finally, Pastor White continued his sermon series, "*Walking With God*," preaching from Exodus 32:1-8 on the subject, "Patience or Resistance."

How blessed we are!!

# **Project Impact, Phase III—Mortgage Elimination**

In 2016, Pastor White introduced us to a plan that he called, Project Impact. Project Impact Phase I was searching for a new home. (In October 2016, we purchased our current facility here on Oak Street.) Project Impact Phase II began in 2017 and continued for about 3 years. This phase focused on preparing our new home for worship by designing and constructing a sanctuary/performing arts theater, updating the facility with a new roof on the historic side, bringing security and elevator systems up to code, creating an Administrative wing of offices, and a lot more. All of which were accomplished. So now we are at Project Impact Phase III—Eliminating our Mortgage.

In 2016, we took out a 20-Year Mortgage. As of today, if we continue to make payments at our current rate, we can pay the mortgage off in another 4 1/2 years, decreasing a 20-year mortgage to 11 1/2 years. Our goal, however, is to pay it off by the end of 2025. To do this, we need at least 40 individuals, couples, and/or groups to donate a minimum of \$3500 between January 2024 and December 2025. (If you choose to do so as a group, get with family and friends, create a team, and name one team member as team captain.)

On <u>Sunday, November 5<sup>th</sup>, "Commitment Sunday</u>," we will ask individuals, couples, and team captains to sign a pledge committing to a payment of \$3500 over the next two years. Donations can be made weekly in regular offering envelopes by simply marking your envelope, 'Project Impact,' 'Debt Reduction,' or 'Mortgage.' You should also use either of these notations when giving via Cash App or Givelify. Donations can also be made in honor or memory of a loved one, or just from you.

More information will be shared during October, but on November 5th, please make a commitment!
